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Create an assignment


1. Go to <http://lingtlanguage.com/> and sign in.
2. Click “create assignment.”


3. Click “Title,” and type a new title.

5. Click “Save.”




Record audio


1. Drag “Voice” from the top of the page to anywhere on the canvas.




2. Record your voice by clicking on the white bubble.

5. To erase your recording and try again, hover the mouse over the blue bubble, and click the "X."




Add text





2. Click “Choose File.”




3. Choose the file from your computer, and click “Open.”

Add a video


1. Drag “Video” from the top of the page to anywhere on the canvas.



2. Paste the link to a YouTube video.




3. Click “upload.”


Add an assignment to a class
